Your Association sent Attorney Krislov another check for \$30,000 on October 12, 2013. This money was received from the RCPA's membership to forward to Attorney Krislov to continue the fight for retirees to keep their healthcare benefits. This case is no longer referred to as the Korshak case because Attorney Krislov and the FOP decided there should be a new Plaintiff who is a retiree and his name is Michael Underwood. The next court date for this class action lawsuit is November 5, 2013 in the Federal Court Room of Judge Holderman.

The Illinois Veto Session will be on October 22-24, 2013 and November 5-7, 2013. I do not anticipate that there will be much business conducted in this year's veto session pertaining to pension issues because it takes a $2/3^{rd}$ majority to make any changes. In the new legislative session of 2014, it only takes a

Officers' families since the Memorial Foundation began in 2007 now exceeds \$2,800,000.00. This assistance is made possible because of the generosity of you and many other donors.

No matter how you measure it, older Americans are falling deeper in debt. The number of people in their 60s who have debt has grown from just under half of that age group in 1998 to nearly two out of three in 2010. And their debt, as a share of their assets, has surged during that time from 10% to 18%. Debt is becoming increasingly common among older people, regardless of their level of income, according to Urban Institute researchers (The Center for Retirement Research at Boston College).

Every City of Chicago annuitant received a letter from the Department of Finance within the past month dated October, 2013. This letter addressed important information pertaining to our retirement healthcare benefits for 2014. We have been informed that for retirees who have retired prior to August 23, 1989, the City will subsidize their health benefits for their lifetimes. Those who retired after August 23, 1989 will have health benefits through December 31, 2014. The pension fund will provide \$95 per month for non-Medicare eligible retirees and \$65 per month for Medicare eligible retirees through 2016. The City informed retirees that the plan will include: Blue Cross Blue Shield PPO and prescription coverage which includes a 5% increase in mail order drugs; a small percentage increase in the co-pays, deductibles and out-of-pocket costs and 90% coverage for PPO for hospital expenses and doctor visits. This is great that the City is keeping its promise to cover retirees but why such a large increase in premiums? The City never had a projected annuitant plan costs study provided to them in 2013.

In previous years, The Segal Group, Inc. had provided such a study. Apparently whoever calculated these increases must have just pulled them out of the sky because there is no logical formula for these increases. My math shows the increases range from approximately 5% on the low end to 41% on the high end. There is no justification for these percentages especially when the Chicago Tribune on October 18, 2013 published that the healthcare costs rise for Chicago employers was only 3% as compared to the national average of 3.3%. With the increases that City annuitants just received, my bet is that the City plans to increase premiums up so high by 2016 that we will voluntarily leave the City plan.

In another part of this newsletter, there will be a membership renewal notice. Yes, it is that time of the year again. Please cut out the notice and return it with your 2014 dues check for \$15.00. If you received a letter in the past month telling you that your dues are paid for 2014, Do Not Send A Check, as you have already paid.

There will be a General Meeting of the RCPA on Sunday, February 22, 2014 at 1:00PM in the 001st District Community Room at 1718 S. State Street. I hope the weather will be mild and you will be able to attend.



This is to remind retirees to send a copy of their Medicare Card to the Pension Board 90 days before they turn 65.

The following is a letter sent by a Retired Officer:

This is the conclusion of the letter I received from City about my health care insurance and not being charged for anything.

First I called the Pension Board and they told me that they are deducting money from my pension check for health insurance and they have no knowledge of why Benefit Management sent me a letter stating that there was no cost for my health insurance. However, because I never sent the Pension Fund a copy of my Medicare card, I have been overpaying for my health care insurance. So far I overpaid about \$4,000.00. This overpayment is non refundable. I know that I faxed copies of both my wife's card and my card to Benefit Management but was not aware that I had to send copies to the Pension Board. I guess being stupid cost me 4 K. My loss..... I called the Office of Benefits Management and inquired about the letter they sent me. Their reply to my inquire was: The letter was sent to up date their records and to notify me what insurance plan they had on their books for me and my spouse. They never put down an amount of what you are paying for insurance. The amount paid is always shown as "None".

So.....make sure that the Pension Fund has copies of your Medicare Card.
